### **PRESIDENT'S PRATTLE**

Two years ago in the February 2007 Bear Facts I told you that the ad hoc finance committee had reported to the board that our rising expenses had exceeded our income, and we were balancing our budget by spending down our savings account. The committee recommended that we reduce expenses and raise revenues.

The expenses that had increased most dramatically were the postage for our newsletter and the parking fee at the International Center. We have no control over the parking fee, but we could reduce postage charges. The board made the difficult decision to decrease the annual issues of the newsletter from nine to five. To raise revenue we asked our membership to approve an increase in the dues, and to support our fundraisers: the sale of La Jolla Money Books, and our Theatre Party fundraiser for Undergraduate Service Awards

Today I am happy to report that our efforts have been very successful. In the 2007-2008 academic year, our income exceeded our expenses. We were able to meet all our expenses through dues and generous donations. Our Theatre Party was so successful that after giving the \$2100 in Undergraduate Service Awards we were able to make a deposit to our savings account. We are on track to be equally successful this academic year. Adding to our savings is crucial to cover large expenses that may occur in the future. Many thanks are given to those who worked to raise funds especially Theatre Party Chair Molli Wagner and La Jolla Money Book Chair Maxine Bloor. Thanks to past President Jane Takahashi for realizing the need for a yearly fundraiser and initiating our Theatre Party. We are grateful to the many members who have generously donated to our operating expenses. You have made a positive difference for our organization.

The 2006-2007 ad hoc committee reconvened in 2007- 2008 and continued to explore how to best be stewards of Oceanids funds. When the Post Office decided that we were not a non-profit organization, the committee researched and proposed that our dues be written to our UC San Diego Foundation Account, making them tax deductible. The Post Office has still

not reinstated our non-profit mailing status, but our contact in the Office of Support Group Services is still pursuing this. This past fall I asked the board to approve a permanent finance committee that will meet at least twice annually to examine our finances and pursue solving any problems that may arise. Over the three years of my tenure as President of Oceanids the members of the finance Committee have spent many, many hours in meetings and research in an effort to balance the budget, keep our finances sound, and look for solutions to any fiscal question. We are indebted to Mary McIlwain, Kim Signoret-Paar, Liz Winant, Estelle Shabetai, and Glenda Rosenblatt for their generosity of time and talent.

Oceanids are amazingly talented and generous. It has been a privilege and a delight to serve you these past three years as president.

We will be traveling via Amtrak on Thursday, May 14 to the picturesque City of Orange. We'll catch the 8:44am from Solano Beach Station that arrives in Orange at 10:03 am. We'll return via the 2:43pm from Orange. This is the last train of the day from Orange to Solano Beach arriving at 4:08 pm. 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Excerpt of a letter from a former foreign scholar

## Submitted by Therese Tanalski, English Tutor to Hong Tjhin

### Hi Therese,

Yes, the tsunami of 2004, I was personally involved in the relief and reconstruction. On December 28, a couple days after the tsunami hit Aceh, on the northern tip of Sumatra island, I flew in with a team of Tzu Chi Indonesia, a compassion relief organization, to offer medical, clean water and food-stuff.

We chartered a plane to land, otherwise the commercial planes were not flying. We had appointment with the Indonesian President, Mr. Susilo Bambang Yudhoyono, at the Aceh's airport. Together with the President of Indonesia, our team surveyed the damage and took notes of what was needed. I stayed back at the airport, since nobody was helping to carry the cargo to the warehouse, I had to do it myself, shoving medical and foodstuff to the emergency warehouse, to be distributed the next day. Soon after the medical teams were joining us and started a medical tour to assist the victims. What I remembered, the smell of dead bodies was horrible, the whole town was full of them. Close to the airport was an emergency cemetery, where thousand and thousands of bodies were buried. I was back and forth around 5 time to Aceh. I was also responsible for finding the ground for the temporary housing: a tent village. And finding two tracts of land in Aceh to house villages of 2700 houses Tzu Chi built there. In the process, I participated in the roundtable meeting with Clinton in Aceh.

Well, to ponder the question of "what effect of the tsunami affected me?". By personally involved in the aftermath (and I went to Aceh also before the tsunami, even during the military emergency time, to assist giving the poor rice) I learned to value life and to try to live it fully aware, not wasting it, making it meaningful for self, as well as for others, in positive ways.

I also took part as part of the International Relief team in Pakistan's Northwest Frontier Provinces earthquake. I lost 10 lbs in 9 days, walking up and down the hilly terrain, trying to understand a local map in Russian, because only the Russians kept track of what's going on in the adjacent Afghanistan.

Why do I do this kind of rescue work?

I do it, partly because of what I learned at UCSD: Revelle College opened my eyes to the importance of humanity; Third College to the current issues facing the world.

And mostly, from you Therese, I learned that we are world citizens -- responsible to make this world a better place to live.

How much did I learn at UCSD that I really use? Around 50% I think, specifically the Operation Research, Regression Analysis, and Accounting.

Take care now, Therese. Really glad to hear from you again.


