At Palm Canyon Drive turn left for the visitor's center and campground at Borrego Palm Canyon, or turn right to go to Christmas Circle in the middle of town.



MARCH SPEAKER:

HUGH DAVIES, PhD has served since 1983 as director of the Museum of Contemporary Art San Diego, with dual facilities in La Jolla and downtown San Diego. He also oversaw the renovation and expansion of MCASD La Jolla (1996), and the opening of the

museum's first downtown facility (1993). In addition to his leadership of the administrative and artistic activities of MCASD, Davies has served as curator or co-curator for numerous exhibitions. In 2004, he received the California Arts Council Director's Award, recognizing his more than twenty years of service to the arts in California. Davies is recognized internationally as a scholar in the field of contemporary and modern art. His professional activities include his appointment as Adjunct Professor, Department of Visual Art, University of California, San Diego. Davies received his A.B., Summa Cum Laude, (1970), M.F.A. (1972), and Ph.D. (1976) from the Department of Art and Archaeology at Princeton University. Since the early 1970s, Dr. Davies' interests have focused on contemporary art.



FEBRUARY'S SPEAKER:

ALLYSON GREEN, MFA, is a choreographer and visual artist who was based in New York from 1986-2001 and joined UCSD in 2003. Her company Allyson Green Dance has been presented to critical acclaim in Austria, Brazil, Belgium, Canada, France, Germany, Great Britain,

Macedonia, Portugal, Slovakia, Romania, Venezuela, and the United States. She has been a frequent international collaborator with such noted choreographers as Ben Wright in London, José Navas and Dominique Porte in Montreal, and Meg Stuart in Brussels. In 1999, Ms. Green was awarded the prestigious Jacob K. Javits Fellowship, and was named the UWM Fine Arts Graduate student of the Decade in 2005. Ms. Green's work has been particularly influenced by her teaching and choreographic research in East/Central Europe. She has been the recipient of eight fellowships from The Suitcase Fund, an initiative created by Dance Theater Workshop with major funding from the Rockefeller Foundation. In addition to her work in dance, Ms. Green maintained an active visual arts career as a painter and an award-winning graphic designer for numerous arts organizations and PBS television. Ms. Green was the Artistic Director of the theater Sushi Performance and Visual Art from 2003-5, for which she was named by the Union-Tribune as one of the top arts leaders in San Diego in 2004. Ms. Green currently serves as Chair of the Theatre and Dance Department at UCSD.

The Revenger's Tragedy by Thomas Middleton Directed by Christopher Ashley Quinn Martin Guest Chair in Directing

About the play:

"The Revenger's Tragedy", a Jacobean revenge tragedy of which Shakespeare's "Hamlet" is the most well known example, was once attributed to Cyril Tourneur. Contemporary scholars, however, consider the play to be of Thomas Middleton's authorship due to its earthy – even obscene—style, irreverent tone and grotesque subject matter: all of which typify Middleton's comedies. The play was first produced in 1606 in the purely Jacobean style of a vivid and often violent portrayal of lust, greed, ambition, and corruption in an Italian court. Sans the usual Jacobean ghost, the play nevertheless typifies the satiric tone and cynicism of much Jacobean tragedy. The play fell out of favor at some point before the restoration of the theaters in 1660; it however experienced a revival in the twentieth century among directors and playgoers who appreciate its affinity with the temper of modern times.

About the playwright:

Thomas Middleton, the son of a London master bricklayer, was educated first at Queen's College (without a degree) and was then admitted at Gray's Inn in 1593. He published three volumes of verse by 1600, and it is believed that he had already begun to write for the stage at that time. His earliest surviving independent play, "Blurt, Master Constable" was printed in 1602. Middleton was an industrious, prolific writer. Among his many works are the citizen comedies -- "Admiral's Men", "A Mad World", "My Masters", "A Trick to Catch the Old One", and "Michaelmas Term". He collaborated with Thomas Dekker on the comedies "The Honest Whore" [Part I], "The Family of Love", and "The Roaring Girl". For the adult companies, he also wrote his masterpiece, "A Chaste Maid in Cheapside". These comedies expose bourgeois vice in contemporary London in a satiric tone. He also collaborated with William Rowley on "A Fair Quarrel", "The World Tossed at Tennis", and the tragicomedy "The Changeling". One of Middleton's last plays, "Women Beware Women" (c.1625), was a tragedy where the final "slaughter" scene verged on comedy, a matter that persuaded critics that Middleton was also the author of "The Revenger's Tragedy" (1607).

About this production:

As we move into the second decade of the twenty-first century, UC San Diego Theatre and Dance Department's Quinn Martin Guest Chair in Directing and first-ever Director in Residence at the California Institute for Telecommunications and Information Technology (Calit2), Christopher Ashley directs the department's riches of artistic talent and Calit2's technological innovators in transforming Middleton's 16th century bloodlust melodrama into a reality show for one of American TV-viewing audience's most programmed and popular TV obsessions.
