

Do you believe it? I don't believe unless I sit back to rock and watch. And watch her turn her face away. And watch dark walk over the desert like Death. Yet she does not look back and we do not fall off. Then. in the black night, I believe it.

I CALL IT SOLAR ENERGY

I know where the mockingbird nests, when the starlings start housekeeping in my palm tree (darn them), how the crop will be on the peach tree, whether the parsley has re-seeded, and how the strawberry plants are doing.

Why? Because I hang out my laundry.

I remember saving to buy that first clothes dryer, in the mid-1950s. Our third child was imminent, and the prospect of hanging outanother set of diapers appalled me. I insisted that the dryer be electric (no gas appliances in the garage, please, where a spark or cigarette could ignite fumes). San Diego electricity rates in those days were the lowest in the nation.

Twenty years and three dryers later I shifted gears. "Hmm," Isaid to me. "Two loads of laundry a week, one on hot, one on warm. The electric bill is going up. How about using the oldclothes line?"

I did, and, to my delight, our electric bill dropped nearly 25%. I still had the dryer to use in a damp emergency, until the moment of truth, when I washed clothes on a rainy day - and the dryer would not work. George installed clothes lines in the garage promptly.

What has surprised me for five years is how rarely I had had to use the back-up lines in the garage. The new materials dry so much faster than did clothes in my childhood. The towels are sometimes stiff, but one good shake fluffs them.

This is a good drying climate, even near the coast, if one hangsclothes before noon and brings them in before about 4 pm when the air turns damp. And the birds are most entertaining. Betty Shor

2 1/2 cups flower SPANISH COFFEE CAKE

3/4 cup sugar

1 teaspoon nutmeg,

Mix together flour, sugar, brown sugar, nutmeg, salt, and oil.

Topping: Remove 3/4 cups of above mixture. Stir in nuts and cinnamon. Save for top of cake.

Topping

1/2 cup chopped nuts

2 teaspoons cinnamon

1 cup buttermilk

1 teaspoon soda

1 egg

To the remainder of the first mixture, add buttermilk, soda, and egg. Beat well. Pour into greased 9X13-inch pan. Sprinkle topping mixture over cake. Bake at 350 degrees F for 45 minutes.

Yield: 12 generous servings.

Comment: "This coffee cake is very moist and keeps well.

I also use it for brunch.



Oceanids' Successful eBay Fundraiser by Jan Ouren

Oceanids eBay fundraiser was a big success this year, thanks to generous donors, a hardworking eBay team and our many customers, some as far away as the Netherlands. Together, we netted over \$3000 for the UCSD Foundation/Oceanids.

This is the first time that Oceanids has tried fundraising on eBay. We had help from I-Ju Tracy, Controller, UCSD Foundation, getting Missionfish (eBay's charity arm) directly connected to our UCSD Foundation/Oceanids account. This tie-in allowed any income from sales to be deposited directly into our foundation account. Then the eBay team proceeded to process donations, research and photograph them, and list them as auction items for sale on eBay. Between February and April, members and their friends offered the team over one hundred items; many of these sold within seven days. After sellers paid, the final step was mailing them their purchases.

A fabulous assortment of jewelry, rugs, artifacts and art were contributed. For example, Mary McIlwain donated the Russian metal travel icon seen above. Historically, icons like this one were used by travelers and soldiers; many are found scattered on Crimean War battlefields. Her icon was bought in Sweden around 1970. Beate Menzel donated a mid-century brooch (second photo). Susan Starr donated a Northwest Indian wall hanging (third photo) purchased in a Vancouver gallery in the 1980's.

The money we raise each year goes to support campus activities and programs such as UCSD's Free Clinic, Friday Café, the Chancellor's 5K Run, and the Ph.D. Conference. Because of this year's success, we are likely to try eBay again. Think what you might like to donate in 2012!


TORNADOES
