

Mary McIlwain, a 50+ Year Story

Oceanids members who are fortunate enough to have known and worked with Mary McIlwain (and there are many) know her as someone who gets things done. Many of us don't know her history with Oceanids which goes back 51 years, or her pre-La Jolla background

Mary and her husband, Carl arrived in La Jolla in 1962 when Carl had been recruited to start the Space Science Group. They had met at North Texas University where they had both been flute majors. A move to Iowa City resulted in Carl receiving his PhD in physics, while Mary earned a B.A. in home economics. They began raising their two children in Iowa where Mary worked in a lab, then moved to California permanently.

The Upper Campus was not yet completed, so all departments were temporarily housed at Scripps Institute of Oceanography. It was there that Mary joined Oceanids at a time when Frieda Urey was "everything" (and continued to be until her death in 1992). Mary was immediately active in the organization and has remained so until the present. According to Mary, she filled every position in Oceanids except President, for which she felt unsuited.

There was a 20-year hiatus during which she worked as Administrative Assistant to Dr. Russ Doolittle, filling a variety of highly responsible roles. Her proudest achievement there was organizing all the details of the International Congress for Thrombosis and Hemostasis in 1975.


Mary has served on the Oceanids Board ever since, having been Financial Secretary for many years until Liz Winant took over that role several years ago. She remembers the difficulty in finding leadership in some of the intervening years, to the extent that it was uncertain that Oceanids would be able to continue its existence.....but look at us now! Mary loves us for our feeling of warmth and family.

An anecdote illustrates the stuff Mary is made of. Several years ago a Budget Committee meeting was being held at my house. About 15 minutes before it was to begin there was a phone call; it was Mary telling me that she had just slipped and fallen in the street in front of her house and fractured her pelvis, and she was sorry, but she wouldn't be at the meeting. That's Mary McIlwain!

Kitchen and Furniture Exchange



The Oceanids Newcomers Kitchen and Baby Furniture Exchange has been in business for almost 39 years. It is located in a garage at the International Center and is open on Wednesday mornings from 10:30 to noon all year round and by appointment. (If someone is leaving the country to return home on a Tuesday, we do not ask them to return the rental items the previous Wednesday.) People usually arrive in this country with just clothes in their two suitcases, leaving no room for housekeeping items. We have basic kitchen equipment (pots and pans, dishes, flatware, glasses) and more (wine glasses, kitchen scales, casseroles, tea pots, etc., etc.) for rent to foreign visitors for nominal rates. The kitchen equipment that a single person takes will cost approximately \$1 per month. A couple can expect to pay \$2 per month, and a family can expect to pay \$3 per month. People are allowed to pick out what they want. Electrical appliances are additional; most are 50 cents a month, but vacuum cleaners and microwaves are \$2 or \$3 per month extra. Most of what we have was purchased new (Corelle dishes, Farberware pots and pans, blenders, mixers, lamps, vacuum cleaners, microwaves.) Some of what we have has been donated, either by visitors themselves who found that they could not live without something that they are used to, some by Oceanids members. We can offer a tax deductible slip for the donations.

Our customers come from all over the world to study at UCSD and each of them has an interesting story. On the morning that Oceanids president Mary Hanson came to visit, she took pictures of a Chilean postdoc in Neurosciences who expects to be here for two years and needed a vacuum cleaner (see photo on right). There was the Indian couple who had come earlier who had left with another of our vacuum cleaners and had come with a sad story: they had purchased a very cheap vacuum cleaner for \$40 at Walmart and it died after only 11 months. They learned that the repair would be more than the original purchase price. They were happy to be able to rent from us and were sorry that they had not originally rented from us at \$2 per month. And there was the mainland Chinese scholar who had to go to the ATM machine in order to pay the deposit which we require to ensure the return of the rented items. Finally, there was a young mother who returned things, saying that their 7-year-old daughter was very upset that they were going back to Brittany just before Halloween, thereby missing all the festivities. This particular Wednesday, our regular volunteers Mary Ruth Cox, Louise Keeling and Estelle Shabetai were away for various reasons. Thus only Jim Chase (below) and I were there to help these international scholars that day. Except for Jim, who has only

December 5, 2013 Steven P. Erie, Professor of Political Science, Adjunct Professor of History, Director, Urban Studies Program

"Has San Diego Solved its Pension and Fiscal Problems? Reflections on the post-Filner Era"

Erie's research interests include urban politics, public policy, ethnic/racial politics, and American political development. He is the author of four books: Rainbow's End: Irish-Americans and the Dilemmas of Urban Machine Politics, 1840-1985; Globalizing L.A.: Trade, Infrastructure, and Regional Development; Beyond 'Chinatown': The Metropolitan Water District, Growth, and the Environment in Southern California; and Paradise Plundered: Fiscal Crisis and Governance Failures in San Diego.



Rainbow's End won best urban book awards from the American Political Science Association and the American Sociological Association. Globalizing L.A. won book awards from Lambda Alpha International Land Economics Society and the Historical Society of Southern California. And, most recently, Paradise Plundered won the best urban book award from the American Political Science Association. He also has written numerous journal articles and book chapters. His current book project is Mulholland's Gift: The Politics and Policymaking of L.A.'s Department of Water and Power. Professor Erie is actively involved in public policy debates on issues of infrastructure, economic development, governance, and public finance. He helped write San Diego's new "strong mayor" form of government; served on the governor's infrastructure commission; and advises public officials, business and community leaders in Southern California on the policy challenges facing the region.

THERE IS NO SOUNDING BOARD IN JANUARY 2014.

On February 6 we will hear Gordon Hanson, Professor of Economics at UCSD. The title of his talk is "Globalization and the American Worker".

BETTY NOBLE SHOR, 1930-2013

Betty Noble Shor died peacefully in her sleep on October 13, at the home of her son, Professor Alexander ("Sandy") Shor, in Honolulu. Known as the "walking memory" of Scripps Institution of Oceanography (having written a history of SIO), Betty also wrote a history of Oceanids. She was a long-time member, and served as co-editor or editor of BEAR FACTS from February 1970 to June 1972, as well as coordinator of the informal Stamp Collecting interest group. Recognition of her contributions to Oceanids came in her designation in 1992 as Oceanid of the Year (along with Jean Lindsley, another early member). George and Betty also enjoyed Wine Tasting (Group I) for many years.

Betty was an expert on bamboo, co-editing the Bamboo Society of America's magazine for several years. In recent years, Betty also did scientific editing for a number of scientists

Science in many ways framed the stages of her life. Born in Boston, where her father was a professor of geology, most of her childhood was spent in Lead, South Dakota, where he served as Chief Geologist of the famed Homestake Mine. Betty graduated from Lead High School, as valedictorian. The next phase involved Cal Tech where her father was a professor. Wellesley College was her home for two years, but she returned to California to marry George Shor, then a graduate student in Charles Richter's lab. Betty worked in that lab for a period, and she also worked at SIO for Professor Carl Hubbs. George went on to become a professor of geophysics at SIO, until he died in 2009. They had three children--Alexander (another professor of geophsyics), Don and Carolyn. The family is planning a memorial service in the spring.

We knew Betty as a neighbor, amazing stamp collector and fabulous bamboo plant expert. She had lived on our block on Ellentown until just weeks before her death. We had enjoyed our interchanges with Betty and yearly i would give her all our Canadian, Foreign and USA stamps for her collections.

Betty was a unique and strong character!! Up to the last few years, there was usually a cigarette in her mouth and til the end there were the braids on top of her head. She was fun to talk with, and let us pick her loquats from her truly most productive fruit tree imaginable!!

Remarkably, she wrote 3 academic books while bringing up three children. It was only on her death that i learned of of her academic prowess.

We will all miss you Betty Shor.
