

Reception for the Frieda and Harold Urey Family

On August 11 Liz Winant, Liz Fong Wills, Eleanor tum Suden, Carl and Mary McIlwain and I enjoyed a reception for several generations of the Urey family sponsored by the UCSD Division of Physical Sciences.

As many of you know, Frieda Daum Urey is considered the "founding mother" of Oceanids. She and her husband, Nobel Laureate Harold Urey, were among the most influential people in the early days of UCSD. When Ruth Stern passed the gavel to me in May it was actually a beautiful silver pitcher engraved with the words:

"From Oceanids to Our Beloved Friend Frieda Urey, February 24, 1968."

The Frieda Urey pitcher has been passed to successive presidents ever since.

The family was given tours of the labs where Harold Urey worked, followed by refreshments and conversation in the recently renovated Urey Room, located in the oldest building on campus, the Urey Building. Two of our fellowships, the Frieda Daum Urey Academic Fellowship and the Frieda Daum Urey Endowed Fellowship, recognize her contributions to the university. Some members of her family were not aware of these awards, and were very gratified to know about them.

Frieda was an exceptional hostess and made a point of making newcomers to the campus feel welcome, which is still an important component of Oceanids' activities. We all enjoyed learning more about about her and her family at this lovely event.

First Latina Provost at UCSD: Faustina Solis (1923 - 2013)

Ms. Solis was always known for her efforts in improving the lives of migrant workers. In her opinion, education was the key to eradicate social injustice.

She was born the eighth of 12

children in Compton. Ms. Solis received a bachelor's degree in sociology from UCLA and a master's degree in social work from USC in 1954. In 1971 she joined the Dept. of Community and Family Medicine at the UC San Diego School of Medicine. After a leave of absence in 1976, to serve as deputy director for the California Department of Health Services, she returned to UCSD in 1978 as full professor and was appointed provost of UCSD's Thurgood Marshall College in 1982. "Her life, interests, and career were the embodiment of the academic and social missions of this college", said Cecil Lytle, provost emeritus of Thurgood Marshall College.

"Parents as the Agent of Change for Childhood Obesity"

Dr. Kerri Boutelle, Associate Professor of Pediatrics and Psychiatry at UC San Diego is a licensed clinical psychologist. Dr. Boutelle is also on the faculty at Rady Children's Hospital, San Diego. Dr. Boutelle has specialized in weight management and eating disorders since 1992.

Dr. Boutelle's research focuses on child and adult obesity treatment, and child and adult binge eating treatment. She is interested in developing new targets for treatment, and in developing novel treatments for overeating. Dr. Boutelle's current research is focused on parent management training to reduce weight, parent and child skills for reducing binge eating, neurobiological mechanisms of overeating and basic science research on overeating. Dr. Boutelle is also a clinical specialist who works with families and individuals struggling with binge eating disorder, weight management, anorexia, bulimia, EDNOS, and other gastroenterological problems.





November 7: "The Old Globe: Theater and Community"

Barry Edelstein, Artistic Director, Old Globe is a stage director, producer, author and educator. Widely recognized as one of the leading authorities on the works of Shakespeare in the United States, he has directed nearly half of the Bard's works. Mr. Edelstein's Shakespearean directorial credits include productions of The Winter's Tale with David Strathairn, Timon of Athens with Richard Thomas, As You Like It with Gwyneth Paltrow and Richard III with John Turturro. Edelstein has taught Shakespearean acting at The Juilliard School, NYU's Graduate Acting Program and the University of Southern California.

He has lectured on theatre around the USA and the world and has written on the subject for The New York Times, The Washington Post, The New

Republic and American Theatre. His book Thinking Shakespeare (called by New York magazine "a must-read for actors") was published in 2007 and is now the standard text on American Shakespearean acting. He is also the author of Bardisms: Shakespeare for All Occasions.

Mr. Edelstein is a graduate of Oxford University, where he studied as a Rhodes Scholar.
