

OCEANIDS WELCOMES NEW MEMBER KATIE BOYER


(here shown with husband Chuck)

February 5, 2015:

Sanford A. Lakoff, Ph.D., Edward A. Dickson Professor Emeritus of Political Science

"Jihadism: Challenge and Response"

Professor Lakoff is founding chair of the Department and a distinguished scholar in political philosophy and science and public policy. He is the author of Equality in Political Philosophy, Democracy: History, Theory and Practice, and Max Lerner: Pilgrim in the Promised Land (1998, University of Chicago Press) and Strategic Defense in the Nuclear Age and Ten Political Ideas that have Shaped the Modern World (September 2011); co-author of Science and the Nation: Policy and Politics, Energy and American Values, and A Shield in Space? Technology, Politics, and the Strategic Defense Initia-



tive. He has also edited half dozen volumes, including Knowledge and Power: Essays on Science and Government. He has contributed over fifty essays to edited volumes, journals, and encyclopedias.

He received his Ph.D. from Harvard University in 1959 in Political Thought, Science and Public Policy.



Thursday, March 5, 2015:

Miriam Kastner, Ph.D., Distinguished Professor, Earth Sciences, Scripps Institution of Oceanography, UC San Diego

"Are Methane Hydrates a Source of Atmospheric Methane, and Do They Have a Potential for CO2 Sequestration?"

Professor Kastner is a distinguished professor at Scripps Institution of Oceanography at UC San Diego. She received a master's degree in geology and a minor in chemistry at Hebrew University in Jerusalem in 1964 and a Ph.D. in geosciences

from Harvard University in 1970. Kastner came to Scripps in 1972, becoming the second female professor at the institution. Her research touches on many aspects of geochemistry from the effects of fluids at subduction zones on ocean chemistry to the abundance and distribution of methane hydrates, stores of frozen methane that exist in conditions of low temperature and high pressure below the seafloor. Methane hydrates have attracted widespread interest both as potential contributors to global warming and as a potential energy source.

Miriam is also a valuable member of Oceanids Cinema Soireé interest group.

Friday Café, formerly known as the International Café, started in 1981 by Dean Phyllis Clark. Rumor has it that Friday Café began with peanut butter and jelly sandwiches. It soon developed into a full meal with a very large following, especially for Barbara Starkey's lasagna.
