



October 5: Julianne R. Howell, Ph.D., Senior Health Policy Advisor in the County of San Diego Health and Human Services Agency (HHSA),

"The Affordable Care Act (ACA): Sustain and Strengthen, not Repeal and Replace"

This presentation will review the major features of the Affordable Care Act (ACA); highlight Covered California and the expansion of Medi-Cal; briefly outline efforts by Republicans in the House and Senate to "repeal and replace" the ACA; and then consider the "next chapter" of the ACA initiated by Congress and the Administration in September 2017. Ample time will be provided to answer questions.

Dr. Howell is participating in the planning and implementation of numerous initiatives created under the Affordable Care Act and advising on County strategy and policy across health and human services issues. She has ten years of experience in Washington, DC, consulting on health issues, principally with



Senator Kerry, Senate staff and the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services. Dr. Howell received her A.B. from Harvard College, a Masters in Urban Studies and Planning from Massachusetts Institute of Technology, and a Masters in Public Policy and Ph.D. from the Harvard Kennedy School.

November 2: Richard C.J. Somerville, Climate Scientist

"How to talk about Climate Change"

The presentation will provide "hints and resources for bridging the partisan divide and having a civil conversation about climate change with family, friends and colleagues."

Richard Somerville is Distinguished Professor Emeritus and Research Professor at Scripps Institution of Oceanography, U. C.San Diego. He is a theoretical meteorologist and an expert on computer simulations of the atmosphere. He received a B.S. in meteorology from Pennsylvania State University in 1961 and a Ph.D. in meteorology from New York University in 1966. He has been a professor at Scripps since 1979. He formally retired in 2007 but remains active in research, education and the communication of climate science.



IN MEMORIAM

Elibet Marshall died April 16 peacefully at her home. She was a long-time Oceanid and member of the Gracious Aging interest group and was known for her witty articles and drawings in the Oceanids newsletter for many years.

Elibet was one of my favourite people and I admired her greatly. She was born in Turkey by Swiss parents who were physicians and working for an Armenian relief organisation. Elibet's autobiography is fascinating and was published. She was a very intelligent woman, funny, entertaining but also serious and concerned. She spoke a handful of languages, seemed to know everything and had opinions.

I collected some of her drawings in a booklet to give to the family when I met them on June 17 at Elibet's home to celebrate her life. What is happening on Campus?

Heard rumors that the surface parking lot north of Muir College will soon disappear? That is correct, BUT these spaces will soon be more than replaced with approximately 1,200 parking spaces in an underground parking structure. This space is northwest from the Faculty Club. The North Torrey Pines Living and Learning Neighborhood will be built on this 10-acre parcel with the parking underneath.

This is a proposed mixed-use development located just north of Muir College and east of North Torrey Pines Road. As the name suggests, the project aims at facilitating living and learning neighborhood synergies between academic departments and students living on campus. The project will address a number of campus needs including on-campus housing and academic and administrative space that was mandated by enrollment growth. The Living and Learning Neighborhood will integrate classroom space near housing, faculty and departments. It will provide approximately 2,000 beds, resident facilities, and support space for undergraduates. In addition to housing, there will be new instruction and research space for departments and programs within the Divisions of Social Science

and Arts and Humanities. The new space will support the undergraduate college system; Sixth College will move from Camp Snoopy (the staging area for new colleges in the center of campus) to these new facilities.

In addition to the 2,000 new beds and 1,200 underground parking spaces, it will also have two academic buildings, eight classrooms and a 600 seat lecture hall, a campus/community craft center, support and gathering space including music and multi-purpose rooms, dining space, a market, a coffee shop, retail space, bike storage and other support amenities.

The project also seeks to provide quality open space related to both housing and academic space. Planned open space improvements include a realignment of Scholars Drive to provide a more comfortable and safer pedestrian and bike environment along Ridge Walk on the eastern edge of the site to facilitate bike and pedestrian movement to the core of the campus. Trees and planted space will complete the approach to this area and will provide seating within a pedestrian mall or plaza type design. Construction should start by July 2018.
