

#### Thursday, February 1, 2018 Samuel L. Popkin, Ph.D.

Professor Emeritus of Political Science / Recall Professor

"The Republican Crackup and the Future of Presidential Politics" The Republican party controls the White House, Senate, and House of Representatives but has been able to fulfill only one of the party's longstanding promises to their voters. This lecture will explain how changes in campaign finance have weakened the ability of the political parties to manage intra-party conflicts. These conflicts made possible the election of President Donald Trump, whose policies have further divided the party. Ample time will be provided to answer questions.

Associate Professor of History

#### "TBA"

His work focuses on piracy, smuggling, and other illicit activities in early America ad the British Empire. He is the founding Associate Director of the new Institute of Arts & Humanities, the Honorary Curator of the Hill Collection of Pacific Voyages in UC San Diego's Special Collections Library, and the Robert and Laura Kyle Endowed Chair of Maritime History at the San Diego Maritime Museum.

His first book, Pirate Nests and the Rise of the British Empire, 1570-1740 (UNC Press, 2015), analyzes the rise and subsequent fall of international piracy from the perspective of colonial hinterlands. The book explores the overt of sea marauders in maritime communities from the inception of England's in the 1570s to its administrative consolidation by the 1740s. Although tradibuckling adventurers on the high seas, pirates played a crucial role on land. Far from a hindrance to trade, their

support burgeoning empire tionally depicted as swashenterprises contributed to commercial development and to the economic infrastructure of port towns.

Professor Hanna received his B.A. in history at Yale University (1996) and a doctorate in the History of American Civilization at Harvard University (2006). He has been awarded numerous fellowships.

## SUCCESS WITH GRAY WHALES by Mary Anne Pentis

The recovery of gray whales from near extinction in the 1930s is quite a success story. They were hunted to an estimated population of only 300 for their stores of blubber which was rendered into oil. After being placed on the Endangered Species List, the herd has grown steadily to about 24000 and their only real threat today is by insensitive and uninformed boaters who race out and harass them.

However the saga of the gray whales and their recovery is not over. The Mitsubishi Corporation, in partnership with the Mexican government, is proposing to build a salt works in San Ignacio Lagoon, Baja California, which some believe may put the herd in jeopardy. This is a significant calving and mating arena and noise, as well as activity, is of great concern. By March, the herd is ready to begin its return journey to their Arctic feeding grounds. Half of the females have givn birth and their calves are now about two months old. The rest of the females are pregnant; they will give birth the following year when they return to the warm waters of the lagoons. Since the groups travelling north are more sporadic, they are harder to locate, and the whale-watching season tapers off.

MEXICO CITY, March 3, 2000— After a ferocious five-year battle that drew in environmentalists, a Nobel Prize winner and Hollywood stars, the Mexican government and Mitsubishi Corp. announced Thursday that they were canceling plans for a giant saltworks in Baja California Sur.

In a surprise announcement, President Ernesto Zedillo said the government had withdrawn its support from the venture because it would alter the stunning landscape of arid desert. The nearby seas offer the last pristine breeding refuge of gray whales that migrate annually between Mexico and Alaska.
