

#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE


This month I'd like to share a bit of San Diego history as we

look forward to our Spring Luncheon in May. We will enjoy the best of San Diego as we gather on the edge of Mission Bay at the Mission Beach Women's Club, founded 1926 (see next-page).

Many of us have grown accustomed to Mission Bay and Mission Bay Park and can't imagine when this wasn't part of San Diego. But those of you who



were here in the early years of UC San Diego, can remember when Mission Bay Park was coming to fruition after decades of development.

Mission Bay Park was originally a tidal marsh that was named "False Bay" by Juan Rodriguez Cabrillo in 1542. The San Diego River had historically shifted its terminus from San Diego Bay to the south, to "False Bay" to the north, until 1852 when the United States Army constructed the first dike along the south side of the river to prevent it from shifting back to San Diego Bay. This made "False Bay" an estuary outlet for San Diego River drainage. The dike failed shortly after its construction was finished, but paved the way for the current San Diego River flood control channel. During the late 1800s some recreational development began in "False Bay," including the building of

hunting and fishing facilities. These facilities were destroyed by flooding that took place years later.

In 1944, a Chamber of Commerce committee recommended development of Mission Bay into a tourist and recreational center to help diversify the City's economy, which was largely military. In the late 1940s, dredging and filling operations began converting the marsh into the jewel that is today Mission Bay Park. Twenty-five millions cubic yards of sand and silt were dredged to create the land forms of the park, which now is almost entirely man-made.

Today, the San Diego River is constrained on both the north and the south by levees (San Diego River Flood Control Channel), and it no longer drains to the ocean through Mission Bay other than a weir located at the entrance to Mission Bay.

Today Mission Bay has 27 miles (43 km) of shoreline, 19 of which are sandy beaches with eight locations designated as official swimming areas.

Several of the water areas are dedicated or restricted to par-



ticular forms of water recreation, with specific separate areas for sailing, water skiing and personal watercraft use.

Mission Bay is one of the premier locations in Southern Cal ifornia for the sport of rowing, or "crew." One of the largest rowing regattas in the country is held on Mission Bay each year in the spring: the San Diego Crew Classic is a two-day competition in eight-oared shells rowed by more than 100 college, club, and senior crews.



**Kitty Fronek** died suddenly after many months of declining health due to congestive heart disease. She was 92.

After spending her teenage years as a prisoner in Terezin (Theresienstadt) concentration camp, she returned to Prague where she attended Charles University for her MD, PhD; she worked as a scientist in Prague until 1964, when she escaped the then communist Czechoslovakia with her husband Arnost Fronek, two young children and only camping gear in their car to the West. They moved to La Jolla in 1968 where she and Arnost both worked in UCSD's Bioengineering Department in vascular research until retirement.

She enjoyed being a member of Oceanids and participated in various interest groups.

She is survived by her husband of 67 years, Arnost, two children with their spouses and four grandchildren.

Sanford A. Lakoff, Ph.D., Edward A. Dickson Professor Emeritus of Political Science

"Democracy in Danger - at Home and Abroad"
Although the title probably speaks for itself, I have in mind the resurgence of nativism, populism, chauvinistic nationalism, and demagogic politics here and elsewhere. Not long ago we in this country were proud of our successes in overcoming racism and addressing the poverty of "the other America." And after the implosion of the USSR, it seemed that the world was headed toward a new era of universal democracy -- and with it a much more cooperative and peaceful world order. That progress is now in jeopardy.

Tom Deméré, Ph.D., Curator of Paleontology, San Diego Natural History Museum

"Broken bones and hammerstones at the 130,000 year old Cerutti Mastodon site, San Diego, CA, USA."

The Cerutti Mastodon (CM) site was discovered and excavated along State Route 54 in San Diego over a 5-month period during the winter of 1992-93 and yielded the partial remains of a single American mastodon (Mammut americanum) in association with evidence indicating that hominins broke the bones 130,000 years ago. This evidence for human activity is diverse and includes bone impact features; stone impact and usewear features; bone, tusk, and stone distribution patterns; differential bone breakage; and bone, molar, and stone refits. Alternative hypotheses do not account for the complex range of evidence at the site.



Tom Deméré attended San Diego State University (B.S., Geology), University of Southern California (M.S., Geology), and University of California Los Angeles (Ph.D., Evolutionary Biology) and has worked at the San Diego Natural History Museum since 1979, where he is Curator of Paleontology.
