PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Hard to believe that 2018 is coming to an end! The next weeks will be filled with parties, celebrations, family gatherings, travel and hopefully a little time for reflection as to what we have accomplished this past year and what our goals are for the New Year.



At the Oceanids An-

nual Fall Brunch in October we were again wonderfully hosted at the Audrey Geisel University House by Thespine Kavoulakis, Oceanids Honorary Chair and Associate of the Chancellor. Thespine enjoys hosting us and we so very much appreciate this special time with her, enjoying the sun and ocean views!

At the brunch I talked briefly about the need to think about how we get to and from campus. The University of California has chosen the UC San Diego campus as one of the campuses that has room (land) to expand student enrollment. Now in the midst of this expansion, the use of large expanses of land for inexpensive parking lots is a fond memory. The UC San Diego Blue Line Trolley will be here in 2021 to provide an alternative way to get on and off campus. This fall the new Osler Parking Structure opened just off Gilman Drive next to the Skaggs School of Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences, providing 1,386 spaces to offset the 975 spaces lost from the closure of the surface parking lots between Muir and Marshall Colleges. These surface parking lots are being replaced by structures that when completed will also include an additional 1,200 underground parking spaces.

In the meantime during construction, a possible solution is to consider using Lyft or Uber to get to and from campus. Also, planning the timing of your visit to campus is helpful. A study was done from October 1-5, 2018, on the availability of parking. Here is a link to the study results: https://transportation.ucsd.edu/parking/availability. html

spaces are full by 12 p.m. If you plan on arriving after that time, head directly to lots that say, "doesn't fill," on the study results at the link above.

As we wrap up the year and head into 2019, we will once again send you an annual report on the

use of Oceanids Funds. Thank you very much for your continued giving to these funds. Please be on the lookout for this report and consider giving a year-end gift.





John E. Schwartz, Ph.D.

Professor Emeritus in the Department of Political Science, College of Social and Behavioral Science, University of Arizona

"Reclaiming Our Freedom"

"Most of us believe that our notion of freedom is pretty much the same as the Founders envisioned. We're dead wrong, though, and that error lies behind the greatest domestic problems our nation is experiencing today. Discovering what freedom actually meant to the Founders also reveals why today's problems keep getting worse and how to solve them."



John E. Schwarz is an American political scientist. He received his Ph.D. from Indiana University in 1967, and then went on to teach at the University of Minnesota from 1966-1970 and the University of Arizona from 1970-2004. He was Chair of the Faculty at the University of Arizona from 1995-1997 and is now a Professor Emeritus in the Department of Political Science in the College of Social and Behavioral Science. In 2006, he became a distinguished senior fellow at Demos, a public policy research organization in New York City.

Schwarz's research and writing initially emphasized democratic politics. Later he assessed the actual results of public policies enacted by Congress, which culminated in a 1983 best-selling book, America's Hidden Success: A Reassessment of Twenty Years of Public Policy. He later turned to evaluating the results of public policies enacted during the Reagan and other administrations, focusing on workers and the larger economy. Schwarz has published six books:

- □ Freedom Reclaimed: Recovering the American Vision. Johns Hopkins University Press, 2005;
- Common Credo: The Path Back to American Success. Liveright Publishing Corporation, 2013

His articles have appeared in The New York Times, The Washington Post, ABC News, The Atlantic, and The New Republic.
