Exhibit History:

In 1989, before Third College was named for Justice Thurgood Marshall, then Provost Cecil Lytle commissioned this exhibition as part of the college's 1990 Cultural Celebration. Titled Close to Home, the show was co-curated by Ken Hedges, then Head Curator at the San Diego Museum of Man and Cliff Trafzer, then Chair of Native American Studies at San Diego State University. The exhibit, mounted at the Grove Gallery, consisted of reproductions of selected photographs from the collections of the San Diego Museum of Man, taken in San Diego's Native American communities around the turn of the 20th century. The show was then loaned to the galleries of the newly opened Price Center for a year.

UCSD's 2007-2008 California Native American Day (CANA-Day) Celebration Committee refurbished and remounted the exhibition at the Center for Library and Instructional Computing (CLICS) Library, where it was retitled AKWAY NYEWA'A: Coming Back Home under co-curators Tere Ceseña and Julie Holder. After CLICS closed in 2011, the photographs appeared briefly at the Loft, Cross-Cultural Center, and Geisel Library. UC San Diego's 2013-2014 CANA-Day Celebration Committee facilitated its move to a permanent home in Peterson Hall in April of 2014.

Exhibit Statement: The Kumeyaay-Diegueño nation encompasses sections of San Diego and Imperial counties, as well as northern Baja California, Mexico. The UCSD campus sits on Kumeyaay land. This exhibit is an effort to make connections between the people in the photographs and present generations; recognizing and honoring historical and living communities in this region.

Oceanids 20/19 – 20/20 Fellowships Awarded -- Putting your gifts to work

Oceanids is awarding three fellowships this fiscal year; a \$3,000 Oceanids Frieda Daum Urey Fellowship, a \$3,000 Oceanids Memorial Fellowship, and a \$3,000 Oceanids Bertha Lebus Fellowship. With guidance from the Graduate Student Financial Support office we have three outstanding recipients.

Ms Kate Durkin is a graduate student at Scripps Institution of Oceanography's Geosciences Division, and recipient of the Oceanids Frieda Daum Urey Fellowship. She graduated from Smith College and spent a couple of years taking courses at the University of Rochester and working, before coming to Scripps. Her main Ph.D project is to constrain the relationship between slab input and slab output in the Izu-Bonin arc system in the western Pacific. In addition to being an accomplished researcher she has been a teaching assistant since her sophomore year and constantly reaches out to the community, teaching and tutoring all grades of students and participating in teacher training workshops. Her advisor describes her as "an exemplary model of a young woman pursuing a career in science". Her ultimate goal is to be a geoscience educator at the university level.

Mr Eric Lybrand is a Ph.D candidate at UCSD Mathematics Department and recipient of the Oceanids Memorial Fellowship. The nomination letter from his advisor says he is "easily one of our best mathematics graduate students". On joining UCSD Eric started working on a project whose aim was to develop a theory of quantization for low-rank matrix recovery, and he has since branched out to other problems in the mathematics of data science. He has already published one journal paper and is in the process of submitting another two. He is also a TA and has been appointed as the Senior TA in recognition of his excellent work, a position that is a strong testament to Eric's leadership, mentorship and commitment to education and service. Eric wants to pursue a career in academia and with this fellowship he hopes to be able to attend more conferences and workshops to get exposure and interact with leading research academics.

Mr Bolun Zhang is a graduate student at the UCSD Department of Sociology and recipient of the Oceanids Bertha Lebus Fellowship. Requirements for this Fellowship are, a period of at least one year between receiving an undergraduate degree and starting graduate studies, and having the long range goal of becoming a teacher at any educational level. Mr Zhang's letter of recommendation says that he graduated from Peking University, with an exemplary academic record. He then took a year off to work as an editor & translator and joined the Department of Sociology in the Fall of 2016. He sailed through the first of his Ph.D qualifying exams a year ahead of schedule, and is "an outgoing and intellectually generous social scientist". His letter of recommendation goes on to say that during the period between undergraduate & graduate studies he volunteered for an NGO that aimed to reduce inequality of opportunity between urban & rural areas in China. He is currently involved in a UC San Diego faculty-led project concerned with urban-rural inequality in educational opportunities in the United States. He intends to be a teacher in a university setting.

We will invite these students to our Spring Luncheon and look forward to meeting them.

Steffanie Strathdee, Ph.D., Associate Dean of Global Health Sciences, Harold Simon Professor, UCSD Department of Medicine, Co-Director, Center for Innovative Phage Applications and Therapeutics


In November of 2015, epidemiologist Steffanie Strathdee and her husband, psychologist Tom Patterson, were vacationing in Egypt when Tom came down with a stomach bug. What at first seemed like a case of severe food poisoning quickly turned critical, and by the time Tom had been transferred via emergency medevac to the world-class medical center at UC San Diego, where both he and Steffanie were on staff, blood work revealed why modern medicine was failing: Tom was fighting one of the most dangerous, antibiotic-resistant bacteria in the world. This story led them to the launch of IPATH at UCSD, which is the first phage therapy center in North America. Dr. Strathdee is an infectious disease epidemiologist renowned for her research on the intersection of HIV and drug use, having generated >600 scholarly publications. She is Associate Dean of Global Health Sciences and Harold Simon Professor of Medicine at the University of California San Diego where she codirects the Center for Innovative Phage Applications and Therapeutics. She is married to Thomas L. Patterson, Professor of Psychiatry at UC San Diego, where they co-direct a research and training program on the Mexico-US border.

Idyllic Background Shapes Her Career an Interview with Dr. Nigella Hillgarth, Oceanids' New President By Jan Ouren

Born in County Tipperary, the Republic of Ireland, Nigella Hillgarth lived close to Lough Derg, a large lake on the River Shannon, bordering counties Clare, Galway and Tipperary. Here, she developed her passion for birds and for water, playing outside near the lake and in the woods, and riding horses. She had three brothers, all older. At age eight, she followed them to boarding school in England, a common practice then to get a good education.

After some nine years in school, she traveled widely and took her first steps toward her lifelong career—she worked for the British Wild Fowl and Wetlands Trust. She later returned to school at Oxford University where she earned a D. Phil. in Evolutionary Biology. Her field of study was pheasants and their evolutionary progress. From Oxford, Nigella was invited to UC Riverside for post-doctoral work. This was followed by a NATO fellowship to the University of Washington and then to the University of Utah as a Research Professor. Not leaving academia but broadening her experience to non-profit administration, she served as the Director of the Tracy Aviary in Utah. Following this, Nigella moved back to California to lead the UC San Diego Birch Aquarium for 12 years, then on to the New England Aquarium as its CEO.

Most recently, Nigella returned to California. She remains focused on environmental advocacy and photography. She is a Research Scientist at the Center for Ecosystem Sentinels, University of Washington, Seattle, and a founding member of the Ocean Collectiv. And luckily for Oceanids, she is our new President. We welcome her and look forward to her leadership.

In 1938, when he was a kid in a small midwestern town, he was playing baseball with a friend in the backyard. His friend hit the ball, which landed in his neighbor's yard by their bedroom window.

His neighbors were Mr. and Mrs. Gorsky.
As he leaned down to pick up the ball, young Armstrong heard Mrs. Gorsky shouting at Mr. Gorsky, "sex! you want sex?! you'll get sex when the kid next door walks on the moon!"

It broke the place up.

Neil Armstrong's family confirmed that this is a true story.
