President's Message

I hope to see all of you at the Spring Luncheon on May 29 at the Bali Hai, which is such a beautiful

venue.

For me it has been a fruitful 3 years as President of Oceanids. I wish success to our future Presidents.

I would like to tell you about my first trip to India in December, 1991.

I was an Invited Speaker at two week-long conferences in Bangalore and Delhi. I took Thai airlines from LA to Calcutta in order to have a stopover in Bangkok on my return, as I had a distant relative in Bangkok who worked for Nike. I had bought a 30 day pass for the internal airline, Indian Airlines, and planned to travel from Calcutta to Bangalore, then to Dehli, and then to many other cities.

When I arrived in Calcutta, my suitcase (and about 30 other people's) didn't arrive on the plane. Thai Airlines said that the plane was overweight in LA and they couldn't put on all the suitcases, but they would arrive in 2 days. I was flying to Bangalore the next day. They couldn't send my suitcase to Bangalore as there was no customs there.

I told them that I would collect my suitcase when I returned to Calcutta in a month. I had my briefcase with my lectures, my meds, my toilet kit, and 5 books (2 guidebooks and 3 books to read, which didn't seem so important now). I figured I could buy some clothes in Bangalore.

I flew to Bangalore the next day and checked into the beautiful accommodations at the guesthouse. Then I was told that some Hindu extremists had just destroyed a mosque in Ayodhya. There was rioting all over India with thousands killed—Muslims killing Hindus and Hindus killing Muslims—fortunately, none of it was aimed at foreigners. Trains were stopped and people were pulled off and clubbed to death. There were many instances of what the newspapers called "roastings"; if there was a Hindu house in a Muslim neighborhood, or conversely, the house would be boarded up with the people inside and burned down.

The Indians at the conference were terrified that there would be a civil war as in 1948. All the stores went on strike and I couldn't buy any clothes. Also, Indian Airlines went on strike and I wasn't sure that I would get to Delhi. But things weren't as bad in Bangalore as elsewhere in India and our conference went ahead as planned. The stores started reopening 4 days later and I was able to buy some clothes (2 shirts, 2 underpants, and 2 pairs of socks). However, the Indian Airlines pilots remained on strike, but some routes were able to be flown using administrators who had been pilots. But not all the routes that I had planned on taking were available. I had to change my itinerary, but was able to book flights to Delhi, then to Agra, Jaipur, Udaipur, Varanasi, and Calcutta.

In Calcutta I was able to get my suitcase and I went to the restroom in the terminal and changed all my clothes. However, the useful lesson I learned was that I could travel for a month with only a briefcase
