Dear Oceanids Board Members,

I am writing to express my heartfelt gratitude for your generous support through the Oceanids Emergency Fund. I received an award of \$1,500 (approximately \$1,290 after taxes), which came at a time when I was facing significant financial and emotional stress.

As an international graduate student pursuing my studies on an education loan, I experienced an unexpected accident at my UCSD graduate housing that led to additional expenses. The financial burden from this incident was difficult to manage alongside the academic and research responsibilities of graduate life. Receiving this support from Oceanids helped me pay a portion of those housing-related charges and brought immediate relief from the financial pressure I was under.

Beyond the monetary help, this assistance truly lightened my mental load. It allowed me to focus again on my coursework, research, and overall well-being without the constant worry of how to make ends meet. Knowing that there is a community at UCSD that genuinely cares about students in times of hardship means more than words can convey.

Thank you once again for your generosity and compassion. Your kindness made a real difference in my life, and I will always remain grateful for the support you provided during a challenging time.


