Oceanids' Spring Luncheon, May 21, 2026, 11am to 2pm


After many years of meeting at the Bali Hai Restaurant, we have decided to branch out. They have served us well and we thank them.

Upcycle Group Show, January 2026

Oceanids members submitted items to the Oceanids Upcycle Group Show in this edition of our newsletter's virtual Gallery of Arts and Crafts. The idea for an Oceanids upcycle show originated in our Day Bridge interest group. Upcycling is the reuse of discarded objects or materials in such a way as to create a product of higher quality or value than the original (AI definition). These items might have been bought at a thrift store, swap meet or garage sale, etc., or found somewhere and creatively recycled, upcycled or transformed in some way (applied broadly). We encouraged the submission of wacky out-of-the-box entries. Just a show for the fun of it, revealing a bit about the process of upcycling and member aesthetics. Here are the entries.

Mary Cutchin, Oceanids

Membership chair, submitted her Goodwill \$22.50 find which she upcycled with a new frame and hung in her home. It's a print by the well-known Mexican artist Francisco Zúñiga. Zúñiga (1912-1998) was known both for his painting and his sculpture and is seen as one of the 100 most

notable Mexicans of the 20th century



Beate Menzel, Day Bridge Interest Group chair, writes about her entry, a decorative item repurposed as a trivet: “This is one of two objects I got from the [Oceanids Spring Lunch] “grab table” which is a little ridiculous but also useful. It is a teak fish, probably right from the 50s or 60s which reminded me of my youth. Look at this beauty! Works as a charming kitchen decoration and as a big wooden coaster for hot pots. What more can you hope for?”



Our next entry is from an anonymous member. She writes: “It's a mermaid, fashioned from a steel drum lid, signed by Haitian metal sculptor, Jonas Pascal. I paid \$2.58 for it twenty-five years ago.” What an appealing sculpture and, as a mermaid, a perfect icon for Oceanids.



Roswitha Enright, Oceanids Newsletter editor, submits her thrift store find—an unwanted man's beige shirt. She transformed it into a super jacket for herself by rolling up the sleeves. Absolutely!



Finally, I (your gallerist) found this already upcycled item at Kobey's swap meet. It's a large twig--painted red with black blotches by the vendor who was selling it for \$3. It's now reused as part of an ikebana display in my home.

Last year, Oceanids began a newsletter column to introduce you to one or more of its 200+ members. Our featured member in this issue is the cellist, Marcia Bookstein. Marcia recently joined Oceanids after meeting Oceanids' past president Jim Bunch while walking her three dogs in the neighborhood. She also participates in Cinema Soiree, one of Oceanids' popular interest groups, where she provides a valuable perspective on films' musical scores.

Marcia recently retired from her role as cellist in the San Diego Symphony, having served a monumental tenure of nearly 47 years. She studied at both the University of California, Los Angeles, and California State University, Northridge, where she received her BA, at the same time auditing Gregor Piatigorsky's master class at USC. In 1975 she auditioned for and became principal cellist of the Jerusalem Symphony. In 1977, she joined the San Diego Symphony as a member of the orchestra's cello section. Marcia was born in Los Angeles, married and raised two daughters in San Diego. One daughter now lives in Portland, working as a fundraiser for the national organization Resource Generation. The other daughter lives here; she founded and works as educational director for the improv theater, Mockingbird Improv. Marcia and other improv students perform there once a month. Her interest in improv is extensive, citing comedy improv's many health benefits.

Other interests include writing Haiku and limericks, gym classes, reading, and taking care of her family's three rescue dogs, Ysabella (from Mexicali), Gnome Chomsky (the only surviving puppy born to Ysabella) and Murphy Einstein Winston (a red greyhound mix). See the photo. Marcia just finished reading the challenging *Capital in the 21st Century* by Thomas Piketty. This was a 3½ year project--perfect for insomnia relief she says.
